Mr. John Henry Scott, a Black freedman, son, and brother, was tragically lynched by a White mob in Oxon Hill, MD on March 23, 1875. He was the second of four racial terror lynching victims in Prince George's County. No one was ever held accountable for his murder.

On October 31, we will gather to properly remember his life and initiate steps to create a future grounded in justice.
